Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board

HB 1480 - Overview

- Created to mitigate the impact of the coronavirus pandemic
- Require licensees to apply for the endorsements
- Allow certain licensees to engage in curbside, takeout, or delivery sales of cocktails and wine by the glass, growlers, and other alcohol products
- No fee associated with endorsements
- Expire July 1, 2023

Washington State
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To-Go Alcohol Safety Requirements



To-go alcohol customers must follow these state requirements and prohibitions.



To-go alcohol must be kept out of the driver's reach.



Opening or consuming alcohol in a motor vehicle is prohibited.*



Public consumption of alcohol is prohibited.**

* RCW 46.61.519 - restrictions on drinking or having an open container in a vehicle.

** RCW 66.44.100 - restrictions on consuming alcohol in public place.



Factory Sealed Bottles, Cans and Kegs Endorsement

Requirements:

- Product must be enclosed in a bag, box, or other packaging
- Must be marked, “CONTAINS ALCOHOL, FOR PERSONS 21+”
- Delivery must be made by persons who are 21 or older
 - Delivery can be made by a third party provider (LCB approval required)

Available for: B/W Restaurants/B/W Restaurant, B/W Caterer, S/B/W Caterer, Snack Bar, B/W Specialty Shop, B/W Tavern, Brewery, Distillery, Distillery Off-Site Tasting Room, Winery, Winery Additional Location



Third Party Delivery Approval

- The sale must be made and processed by the licensee or their direct employees;
- The contractor must be paid a flat service fee and cannot receive a percentage of sales; and
- Orders and payments must be fully processed before alcohol leaves the licensed business.

Pre-Mixed Cocktails and Wine To Go Endorsement

Requirements:

- Food:
 - Spirits, beer and wine restaurants - 3 ounces of spirits may be sold per complete meal
 - Beer and wine restaurants - a minimum food service item must be sold with the alcohol
- Must be packaged in containers that are sealed in a manner designed to prevent consumption
- Ice may not be put directly into to-go cocktails
- Alcohol to-go containers must be placed in the trunk of a vehicle or beyond immediate reach of the driver and any passengers
- Delivery must be made by employees of the licensed business. Third party providers may not deliver.

Available for: B/W Restaurant (wine cocktails only) and S/B/W Restaurant



Growlers Endorsement

- Requirements:
 - Growlers must be filled at the tap by the licensee at the time of sale, except that beer and wine specialty shops and breweries can prefill growlers
 - Sales of growlers must meet federal TTB requirements
 - Delivery must be made by employees of the licensed business. Third party providers may not deliver.

4. Processing time is approximately 14 days or less

Allows a licensed <i>Beer/Wine Restaurant, Spirits/Beer/Wine Restaurant, Beer/Wine Tavern, Liquor Caterer, Snack Bar, Domestic Winery, Domestic Brewery/Microbrewery, Domestic Distillery/Craft Distillery, or Non-Profit Arts Organization</i> to sell alcohol products at retail for curbside and takeout service, delivery, or both. |

WAC 314-03-505
Allows a licensed <i>Beer/Wine Restaurant or Spirits/Beer/Wine Restaurant</i> to sell wine by the glass or premixed wine drinks by the glass for curbside service and delivery.
Allows a licensed <i>Spirits/Beer/Wine Restaurant</i> to sell premixed cocktails and cocktail kits for takeout or curbside service and delivery. |

WAC 314-03-510
Allows a licensed <i>Beer/Wine Restaurant, Spirits/Beer/Wine Restaurant, Beer/Wine Tavern, Domestic Brewery/Microbrewery, Domestic Winery, Beer/Wine Grocery Store, Beer/Wine Specialty Shop or Hotel</i> to sell growlers for curbside, takeout, or delivery service. |

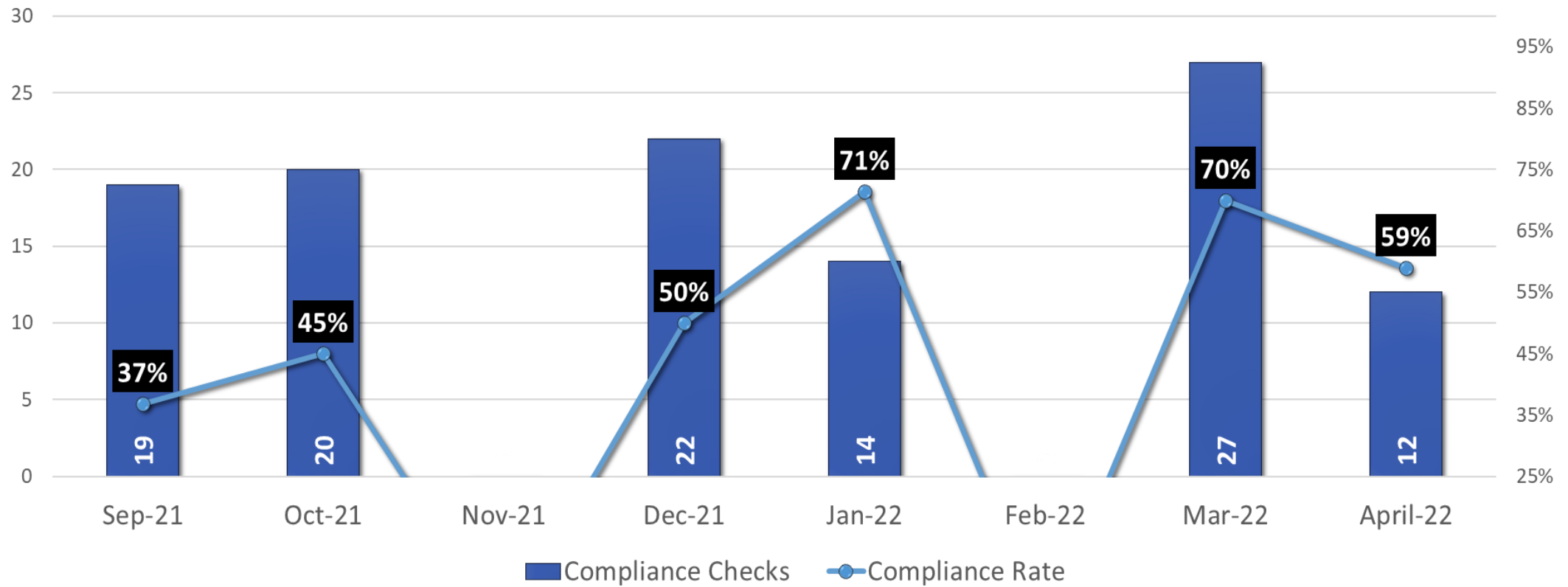

Trends

- Do not have the proper endorsements
- Companies delivered prohibited bottle sizes of spirits
- Did not have appropriate labels on the outside of bag identifying the alcohol – receipts are not acceptable
- Delivery drivers did not check the ID
 - Some checked the ID of the minor, but still delivered the alcohol
- Not obtaining signatures for alcohol
 - Licensees must keep these records



Trends (cont.)

- Delivered by third-party companies such as DoorDash, GrubHub, Caviar, and Instacart
 - Third party companies hold no liquor license
 - Lack alcohol training
 - Limits to what they can deliver
- ❖ A licensee is accountable for all deliveries of liquor made on its behalf
